

This month I want to talk about something unusual, inspired by a true story someone shared with me. Aspects of the context of the story have been modified to disguise the identity of the informant whilst preserving the substance of the story. It is my prayer that this account will provoke deep thought and a change in behaviour for anyone who might be see themselves in the depiction below.

Bode had just settled into a small cozy restaurant at the club with his friends after a round of golf when his phone rang.

Bode: Hello goat. What's up? **(All heads at his table turned in his direction, obviously taken aback by his salutation. After 2 minutes of chatting, Bode ended the call, but the curiosity of his buddies had been aroused).**

Allen: Forgive me Bode, I couldn't help overhearing your conversation; it seemed to me that the person you were speaking with is quite familiar to you.

Bode: Of course **(Bode grinned)**, I was talking to my wife.

Allen: Your wife? (asked Allen incredulously) You called the person a goat. How could that have been your wife?

Bode: **(laughing)** It's my wife. That is my pet name for her.

Chibuzo: You can't be serious **(Chibuzor, another friend, interjected).**

Bode: Chibuzo, why can't I be serious? **(said Bode with a tinge of anger in his voice)** Do you have a pet name for your wife?

Chibuzo: Of course I do.



Bode: So you can have a pet name for your wife but I can't?

Chibuzo: That is not what I'm saying. I'm just shocked that the pet name for your wife is 'goat'. I call my wife 'honey'. It would never occur to me to label her anything negative or derogatory.

Bode: That is where we are different. I am a realist not a pretender. I have given my wife a name that reflects who she is. She is extremely stubborn and she knows it. You overheard our conversation, would she have stayed on the line to talk to me if she had a problem with the name?

Chibuzo: Do you not think that by labelling her 'goat' she will continue to display goat attributes?

Bode: And how is that your business? Is she your wife? Has she complained to you? You don't think my entire family knows this is her pet name and yet no one has complained? Please mind your own business, I do not appreciate being told how to run my own family!

Allen: *(Before Chibuzo could respond, Allen intervened, signalling to him not to respond)* Bode, let me apologise for starting this. I guess I was also taken aback by what I heard. You're absolutely right, no one can tell you what to do with your family.

The above story is a combination of wickedness and stupidity. Wickedness by the very fact that Bode could give his wife 'goat' as a pet name knowing full well what goat signifies (stubborn and misbehaved, not smart); stupidity because he didn't seem to realise the power of the tongue and how by such a continuous negative confession the goat attributes are established in his wife's life. Being known for unbridled stubbornness is bad enough, it is worse to formalise the behaviour through careless talk.

A Christian man is supposed to build his wife, help her to form Christian character and honour her in all ways. How terrible must it be that a wife's pet name is 'goat'! You may not have gone that far as to label your wife a goat, but how do you address her? Do you use sweet names which endear her to you? Names that speak life to her and make her stand out amongst her peers? If you cannot answer in the affirmative then it is time to make amends.

Oh wife, what about you? How do you address your husband to family and friends? As: That useless man? Idiot? Stupid? Irresponsible? Do not be surprised at all when he begins to act out the descriptors. What you sow with your mouth you shall reap – James 3:2-12.

Let's turn our attention to the 'goat' woman in our story. From all indications she was not bothered by her husband's pet name. She had gotten used to it. What does this signify? A lack of self-worth; or what kind of woman will take delight in having 'goat' as her pet name? This anomaly is not restricted to married couples. Even friends and family members give and submit themselves to non-edifying salutations which I find quite unfortunate and distressing. In popular Yoruba pop culture, it is commonplace for young people to greet themselves with invectives such as Ode (foolish), Olosi (unlucky), Oloriburuku (cursed), Omokomo (wretched person). You just need to watch one Nollywood Yoruba movie and you will understand my drift. It's terrible! Christians are also not left out of the trend.

Be careful! Do not allow anyone to give you a name that is not yours. You are wonderfully and fearfully created. You are the apple of God's eye. That is what God says. So please, go forward in that knowledge.

THE BODY OF Christ

The physical body is made up of many parts, each part doing different functions to keep the body as a unit. Every part is needed for the body to function optimally. The body of Christ is designed to function this way. The Bible calls us, one body, many parts – 1 Cor.12:12-14:

12. For as a body is one and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ.

13. For by one Spirit are we baptized into one body, whether we be bond or free, and have been all made to drink into one Spirit.

14 For the body is not one member but many.

The eyes cannot smell, the nose cannot see. The mouth cannot hear, neither can the ear eat. The tongue cannot chew, neither can the teeth taste.

As members of the Body of Christ, we need to understand our individual roles in the body. We are not to compete but to complement one another. If we understand this, we will not expend our energy, trying to be like somebody else. However, there is nothing wrong in being challenged by one another to be better Christians. This is a healthy rivalry if it is not borne out of envy.

The Body of Christ also serves to strengthen one another. 1 Thessalonians 5:10 – "So comfort and strengthen one another, just as you are doing. There are strengths and weaknesses that we carry around. Our areas of strength are meant to be deployed to strengthen those who are weak and

we are supposed to learn from those who are strong in our area of weakness.

I have about three weaknesses that have troubled me for a long time and I have looked for ways to rather strengthen:

1. VISITATION

Visitation is like a burden for me and I know that visitation is one of the commandments of our Lord Jesus. He said "I was hungry and you fed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was in prison and you visited me, and you will ask, when did we do these things and I will say, as long as you did it for these ones, you have done it to me. Mathew 25:36.

My source of strength is to follow the visitation time table and join myself.

2. EVANGELISM

Evangelism is a challenge for me. It is a command: "Go into all the world and preach the gospel" - Mark 16:15. We don't have any excuse. The move I have made is to remain in groups involved in active evangelism so that I can be motivated by those who have passion in this area.

3. GIVING

Giving has different levels of commitment. I not comfortable with my level of giving. What I therefore do is to make sure that I am a part of as many donations announced as much as possible.

We can only be fulfilled as members of the Body of Christ when we are sources of blessings to people around us and we also learn from other members of the church that can be source of strength in our areas of weaknesses.

3. One thing I know about givers is that they never lack.
 4. The greatest investment you can ever have in life is investing in the things of God. Why? It has rewards both in this world and in the world to come.

5. Do you know that God can bypass you and raise up help for His servants? God proved that in the life of Prophet Elijah - 1 Kings 17:3-

7. God did not give the glory of taking care of the prophet to human beings. God gave it to birds. When God says He wants human beings to be involved, the only implication is that God is set to bless you. And when you look at Mark 9:41, there is blessing in taking care of the servants of God. It is the responsibility of parishioners to take care of their Pastor.

6. 2 Chron 31:4 - When the priest are comfortable, they will give you their best. When the priest is adequately provided for, he will focus on the ministry that has been committed into his hands.

7. 2 Chron 31: 5-10 – Know that when you bless a man of God, he will bless you genuinely from the depth of his heart.

8. 1 Corinthians 9:11 - Taking a queue from the verses above, we will see that apostle Paul was not saying something new, he was saying what was already in existence. In 1 King 17:8-16 How God directed Prophet Elijah to the widow to take care of him. In obedience there is a lot of blessing. If you want God to start a series of blessing in your life be a part of what is going to happen very soon.

9. 2 King 4:8-37 - Perhaps that situation in your life is just waiting for a day like this when we are doing Clergy appreciation to turn around. If you take part in this exercise, I want to assure you that God will open for you a door of blessing that no power in this world will be able to close.

10. When you also look at the life of Jesus Christ, you will see that He was taken care of by people. He could have provided for himself, after all He commanded Peter to go to fish and from the mouth of the fish Peter got money. He could have taken care of himself. He wanted people to be blessed. This was the same man who multiplied bread and fish to feed 5,000. He wanted people to be blessed.

11. Your giving will help Priests to meet their needs and those of their families. Some are in rural missions and need support to sustain their missionary fervor.

In closing, according to 1Corinthians 15:58, your giving towards this exercise will never be in vain.

As you take care of God's servant he will take care of you and meet you at the point of your need miraculously. Where others are saying there is no way for you God will make a way, it will be easy. God will prosper the work you do and expand your coasts, He will take you to higher grounds.

Solomon got wisdom from God at MIDNIGHT. If you are not receiving something good at midnight, then chance are high that there are evil changes happen against you at MIDNIGHT.

- Very wicked operations happen at MIDNIGHT but we can change that. We must arise and fight. We must wake up and pray. If we do, we can have great impact in our societies and churches.

David, the man who never lost a single battle in all his life, has this to say:

At MIDNIGHT, I will rise and give thanks to You, because of your righteous judgments. (Psalm: 119:62). What excuse do you have? Do you say, "I wish I arise but I'll be tired"? Do you have a busier schedule than that of King David (president of the nation of Israel?). I don't think so.

- Do you know better than what Paul and Silas knew? Who praised and worshipped God at MIDNIGHT: But at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them.

Suddenly there was a great earthquake so that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were loosed. (Acts 16:25-26)

- **MIDNIGHT** is the best time to make serious intercession: And He said to them, "which of you shall have a friend, and go to him at MIDNIGHT and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves


; for a friend of mine has come to me from a journey, and I have nothing to before him;' And he will answer from within and say, 'Do not trouble me; the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot rise and give it to you'? I say to you, though he will not rise and give to him because he's his friend, yet because of his persistence he will rise and give him as many as he needs." **(Luke 11:5-8)**

- Praying at MIDNIGHT is a sacrifice that will not go unrewarded. God sees our desperation through the sacrifices we make in him. He understands the situation every one is passing through. Let us turn to God and trust in his ability. Always believe in Him wholeheartedly. Praise God.





In order to avoid the pitfall of self destruction in life and ministry, it is essential we commit our ways to the hands of God.

Trust in the Lord with all your heart,
And lean not on your own
understanding; In all your ways
acknowledge Him,
And He shall direct your paths.

Prov3:5-6

When we are confused or hopeless like Peter was in **Luke 5:1-7**, it becomes very pertinent we surrender every thing to God to manage for us. Peter had been on the high sea all night fishing without a catch. He surrender his boat to be used by the creator Himself (**John1:1-2**). After the Master has finished His sermon, He instructed Peter to launch out to the deep for a catch. Ordinarily, no experienced fisherman would take Jesus seriously knowing fully well that it is easier to catch fish at night than during the day. However, faith in the word of the Master made Peter to say '... at thy word I will cast out the net'. Just by following the Master's instruction, he had nets breaking catch he had never caught all his life. So what we need to do to experience our expected miracles and to

terminate frustrations is to invite or wait on God for direction. Peter followed divine instruction and his frustrations were turn to bumper harvest. Not only that he was instantly promoted to become fisher of men (**Luke5: 6**).

Let us look at the lives of some individuals who waited on God for direction. Take David for example, he never fought a war without asking for divine direction. **1Kings 30 :7**. No wonder he could say 'he led me by the still water and restored my soul. . .' David never lose a battle! Another example is King Hezekiah in **2Kings 20** when confronted by three nations. He inquired from God and was directed to offer praise alone in the battle field. He obeyed the Lord and had great victory.


HOW CAN OUR STEPS BE ORDERED BY GOD?
